The Warringah Amateur Swimming Association takes great pride in its ability to provide numerous benefits to our member clubs and swimmers. In 2019, we are pleased to once again be in a position which enables us to provide several Swimming Scholarships to our swimming members.

Successful past recipients of these scholarships have demonstrated a commitment to swimming within their own clubs and within the Association. Designed to encourage swimmers who have proven their commitment to the sport of swimming, these scholarships do not necessarily recognise the fastest swimmers, but those who are bettering themselves and contributing to their clubs in a meaningful way.

In 2019, we are offering the following Swimming Scholarships, detailed below:

- The Dick Gallie Memorial Scholarship
- Up to four Warringah Amateur Swimming Association Winter Training Scholarships
- Five Northern Beaches Council Awards comprising Entry Passes to the Warringah Aquatic Centre to be issued in conjunction with training with Big Blue

Swimmers nominated should have demonstrated a good all-round attitude, as well as swimming skill, which will benefit them from being a successful WASA scholar.

A swimmer may be nominated for one, two or three scholarships, **but may only win one scholarship** in any year. All nominations received from member clubs will be carefully considered by the Selection Committee, with the winners announced at the Association's Annual General Meeting on 6 May 2019.

THE DICK GALLIE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded annually to a deserving swimmer in memory of the late Dick Gallie's contribution to the Warringah Amateur Swimming Association and School Swimming NSW.

Dick Gallie was a qualified Referee who worked tirelessly at Warringah meets and trained many new Technical Officials. He officiated at Metropolitan, State and National Championships on a regular basis.



He particularly enjoyed working at school carnivals and, from late January to April, worked daily in the Sydney Metropolitan area.

He was WASA's Treasurer for 16 years and held several positions on a number of committees in WASA and with Swimming NSW.

He was also widely involved in community service and, for many years, was an elder in his church, a volunteer at the Stony Range Wildflower Reserve in Dee Why, at the hydrotherapy pool at Mona Vale Hospital and was a Scout leader.
